Prior to the existence of ShareLife, money was raised separately for St. Augustine's Seminary and the important projects made possible by the Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace. In 1976, ShareLife was created when Catholic Charities withdrew from the United Way of Greater Toronto after that organization admitted Planned Parenthood, an agency involved in abortion referral. When ShareLife was formed, it became the fundraising organization in the archdiocese for Development and Peace, St. Augustine's Seminary, and the agencies of Catholic Charities, some of which had been serving the City of Toronto for over a century.

St. Augustine's Seminary is the major seminary of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Toronto. It also welcomes candidates from elsewhere. Its primary purpose is the preparation of candidates for ordained priesthood in the Catholic Church. This preparation embraces and promotes spiritual formation, theological education and field training. The seminary is also mandated to form men and women aspiring to other ministries in the Church. Seminarians attend classes at Toronto School of Theology, studying such subjects as Scripture, Christology, Sacraments, the Trinity and grace, biomedical ethics, canon law, and parish administration. St. Augustine's itself was built in 1913 and today the classrooms are used by such groups as the Permanent Diaconate and Ministry to the Deaf. In the first 75 years, 1,800 men have graduated. The majority have become parish priests. Some have worked in jails, hospitals and schools.

St. Augustine's Seminary also has a downtown campus known as Serra House, which is a residence for seminarians engaged in philosophical studies at various universities.

*Note: Seminarians are available to speak on the weekends of March 10/11 and 17/18. While stipends are not required for seminarian speakers, assistance with travel expenses is encouraged.*
